## Questions to detect a foolish heart (Prov. 18:2)

- 1. Do I self-define right and wrong? (Prov. 28:26, 12:15)
- 2. Do I speak without thought? (Prov. 15:28, 12:23)
- 3. Do I seek confirmation from those who agree with me? (Prov. 13:20)
- 4. Do I bristle at correction? (Prov. 17:10)
- 5. Do I live in a real world? (Prov. 17:24)
- 6. Do I repeat the same mistakes over and over? (Prov. 26:11)
- 7. Do I allow emotions to control me? (Prov. 27:3)

Prov. 28:26

He who trusts in his own heart is a fool, But whoever walks wisely will be delivered.

Prov. 12:15

The way of a fool *is* right in his own eyes, But he who heeds counsel *is* wise.

Prov. 15:28

The heart of the righteous studies how to answer, But the mouth of the wicked pours forth evil.

Prov. 12:23

A prudent man conceals knowledge, But the heart of fools proclaims foolishness.

Prov. 13:20

He who walks with wise *men* will be wise, But the companion of fools will be destroyed.

Prov. 17:10

Rebuke is more effective for a wise *man* Than a hundred blows on a fool.

Prov. 17:24

Wisdom *is* in the sight of him who has understanding, But the eyes of a fool *are* on the ends of the earth.

Prov. 26:11

As a dog returns to his own vomit, *So* a fool repeats his folly.

Prov. 27:3

A stone *is* heavy and sand *is* weighty, But a fool's wrath *is* heavier than both of them.
